Reports of Loose Dogs in Lakewood

The City Ordinance Art I, Sec 14-5: "It shall be unlawful for any person to allow or permit an animal owned or possessed by him, other than a cat, to run at large."

Your dog must be confined at all times, even on your property, by a sufficient fence and/or humanely chained in such a manner that he cannot leave your property. Failure to properly confine your dog can result in a fine and/or summons to Municipal Court.

I hope all is well. I'd like to start by saying it's a pleasure being your City Councilman. I've enjoyed meeting those of you I've had the opportunity to meet and I'm looking forward to meeting more of you. Last year was a great year for District 3. This year Bayway drive and surrounding areas have a lot to look forward to.

In last year's letter I mentioned the intersection of Bayway Dr. and Baker Rd. was on schedule for repairs. Those have been completed. I'd like to say "Thank You" to GCCISD, The Rotary Club, and The City of Baytown Parks and Recreation Department for a job well done in upgrading the playground at Travis Elementary.

Also mention in last year's letter was the Mall redevelopment. Although the date has been pushed back a few months the Mall redevelopment is going to happen. There will be some preliminary site work being done. Material will be staged in the parking lot and some signage will be erected stating the Redevelopment will be underway.

As for this year, I'm happy to say El Toro will be breaking ground on their new facility. Kenco, the purple bucket truck company, will be to expanding their office, adding more parking for their employees, and will also construct a training field. I'm glad to see businesses, who have been in our community for decades, deciding to expand and continue to call Baytown home. Especially those along Bayway Drive.

I've received plenty of phone calls, texts, and emails about the future of Bayway Dr. Majority of the calls have come from Lakewood residents. Lakewood Neighborhood Watch

Lakewood Neighborhood Watch (LNW) is simply a program of neighbors watching out for each other during the workday, evenings, vacations or any other absence. The purpose of the Neighborhood Watch program is to create an alert neighborhood by using simple crime prevention methods. The program works through the mutual aid of neighbors watching the property of other neighbors. This has several advantages, including the fact that your neighbors know who you are, what type of vehicle you drive, and who belongs, as a rule, at your residence. A patrol officer driving by your home might not recognize someone as a stranger in your yard or driveway. However, an alert neighbor would recognize the person as a stranger. They could then call 9-1-1 to alert the police of the suspicious activity. Neighborhood Watch does not promote vigilantism. Members of Neighborhood Watch groups are never asked to put themselves in harm's way to prevent crime. They should only observe and report suspicious activities to the Police Department. This leaves the responsibility for confronting and apprehending criminals where it belongs – with your professional Baytown Police Officers.

The greatest tool we have is a sense of watching out for our neighbors and neighborhood and the next best tool is our phone to call in and report a potential crime. Give as much detail as you can about the vehicle and the person in question. Most cellphones have a camera use it.
